

Country of Origin Essentials

Knowing which country or region the limited-English-speaking client comes from enables us to choose the right interpreter.



According to recent census data, 21% of Canada's population speak a language other than English or French as their mother tongue.

Placing an order for an interpreter is quick and easy when all of the required information is readily available.

The client's country or region of origin is an essential piece of information ordering parties do not often provide.

Most times, the ordering party will know the client's primary language but will not know the specific dialect of that language.

COUNTRY OR REGION IS IMPORTANT DUE TO THE WIDE RANGE OF VARIATIONS

The chart below shows a few examples of primary languages and their variations. It's easy to see why simply requesting a Chinese or Arabic interpreter is not enough information to pinpoint the ideal interpreter for the assignment.

Some questions you can ask include:

- What language do you speak?
- What dialect do you speak?

If that doesn't work, then try and gather geographical information:

- Which country are you from?
- Which city or town did you live in?

Supplying this information will help the Interpreting Coordinator make the best decision possible with the information on hand.
